



Greetings Friends:

Our Rotary Club, the Monarch Beach Sunrise Club, has decided to support the Haiti disaster relief efforts in a typical Rotary way—That is, Rotarians to Rotarians, direct, hands on, support at the disaster site.

We have elected to support the delivery of “Shelter Boxes” to Haiti. Shelter Boxes are configured to support disaster areas with most needed supplies, and delivered within hours to the disaster location.

A typical Shelter Box containing a 10ft by 10ft tent can be filled with tools and supplies to support ten persons for six months. Or be filled with other items, such a medical equipment and supplies, in support of damaged hospitals—see website www.shelterboxusa.org for more details.

It’s important to note that Shelter Box Response Team members, Rotarians David Eby from Tennessee, Wayne Robinson of Georgia, and Mark Pearson from the UK are already “on the ground” in Haiti with the first shipment of Shelter Boxes. Due to the efforts of these Rotarians, and other “on the ground” Rotarians and volunteers, Shelter Boxes are being distributed to those in need right now!

These Shelter Boxes cost \$1,000 each, delivered to the disaster site. Our Club has purchased two Shelter Boxes already and with your help we could purchase at least several more. As noted above a large number of “Boxes” have already been delivered to Haiti, but it is estimated that as many as 3,300, or more, will be needed as the recovery effort continues.

If you would like to help us with this effort, please send us a check in as large an amount as you can--\$50, \$100, \$500, \$1,000 or more.

COLOMBIA BOYS & GIRLS CLUB

Monarch Beach Sunset Rotary, Laguna Niguel Rotary, and San Juan Capistrano Rotary have joined with South America Rotary in Neiva, Columbia and have received approval for a Matching Grant project.

The project is to provide aid for education and to purchase equipment and furnishings in order to implement an after school educational program tailored after the "Boys and Girls Club" in California. The "Club de Niños y Ninas" will be part of a public school in Neiva, Colombia, at the "Institución Educativa Reynaldo Matiz Trujillo".

The club will be for children between the ages of 6-12 years old and will develop educational programs related to normal day-to-day school activities for students of low economic means. This program will help children take advantage of their free-time after school due to a lack of help at home from parents and family members and is projected to help up to 1000 children.

The project's purpose is to increase educational levels and GPA averages which will ultimately help future employment prospects. The estimated length of time from project approval to project completion will be three months.

Rotarians from the Neiva Club will be participating in the maintenance of the project together with the school administrators. The Institucion Reynaldo Matiz Trujillo School owns their building and land which are adequate to develop the project. The Rotary Club of Neiva identified the need for the project, and requested cost estimates in cooperation with the Monarch Beach Sunrise Rotary in Dana Point, California.

The Rotary members of the Neiva Club will be purchasing the items specified and will coordinate the project. They will also have the obligation to administer the monies for the project and the supervise the expenditure of funds followed by periodic written reports. These reports will be given to Monarch Beach Sunrise Rotary for continue monitoring. The Monarch Beach Sunrise Rotary Club is constantly in communication with the Neiva Club by email, phone and by personal contact through Margarita Martin, International Committee Chair.

Margarita will travel on a quarterly basis with other members of the club to Neiva and will coordinate the project and all official activities. The equipment will be purchased in the country of Colombia to accomplish the project faster and contribute to the local economy.

The total Matching Grant financial commitment is of \$20,747.00 dollars.





Colombia Project Update

As reported earlier, the Colombo-American Education Foundation and the International Rotary Foundation have been working together for the last three years to help the Colombian students at the Reynaldo Matiz School to obtain a better and higher level of education. Three years ago, work on a computer lab project was begun that today is a reality.

Sixty computers were obtained that were partially refurbished and mostly donated, and reprogrammed with Windows 95 in Spanish. This project has been directed to an elementary school with one thousand children, located in the small city of Neiva, Colombia. A computer lab for education, and a computer maintenance lab for computer hardware education, will be opened to serve these students. The computers have finally arrived and we are on our way to complete this fabulous project!

Margarita Martin, as the lead coordinator for this project, has personally learned that perseverance and patience is a virtue. She will be traveling to Colombia during the month of August and September to ensure the success of all the efforts. She wants to thank all of you for believing in a better world and making this project a success. She is looking forward to meeting the Rotary partners in Colombia during her trip and has heard that they are very excited about this project and are looking forward to its completion.



MBSR Member Nominated For Woman of the Year Award in Colombia.

During the month of September, Rotary Club member and President of the Colombo-American Education Foundation, Margarita Martin, spent 6 weeks in Neiva, Colombia, assisting in the completion of the first after school Boys and Girls Club there. The project involved the outfitting of two computer lab classrooms at the Reynaldo Matiz School. The school has an enrollment of one thousand students, but the Lab will also be open to other schools with the hope of teaching computer literacy to a wider range of students.

The Monarch Beach Sunrise Rotary Club, with assistance from partner Clubs in Laguna Niguel, San Juan Capistrano, and the Rotary Club in Neiva, Colombia, along with financial assistance from the Rotary Foundation, planned and executed this project. The project had been in planning for three years.

The "Vision" has become reality. At the front door of the Computer Lab is a marble plaque dedicated to "The Lost Children of Colombia-Killed by Violence."

Margarita, a member of the Monarch Beach Sunrise Rotary Club, and the leader of this project, was born in Bogota, Colombia and has been a resident of Laguna Beach for many years.

The Colombian Department of Education nominated Margarita for the "Woman of the Year Award for her dedication and hard work." The women considered for this award are judged according to the following criteria:

1. Women who recognize human values as most important.
2. Women who teach us the value of life itself.
3. Women who help protect and nurture people as if they were their own children.
4. Women who plant the seeds of commitment, and in silence show us the value for love and life.
5. Women who have the spirit of philanthropy. They live to give a helping hand and in silence they show us the real value of life.

"Obviously, I appreciate this great honor, but more importantly I am proud to serve and give thanks to the many Rotarians who have participated in the development of this project. And also for supporting the vision that more education opens more opportunities and enriches the lives of those that receive them."

Margarita has been involved in local and international charity work for over 25 years. She is the Founder of the Colombo-American Education Foundation, and an Honorary member of the Rooster's organization, in addition to being an active member of her Rotary Club.




Friendships quickly ensued when laughter and lively conversation brought everyone together in a spirit of true fellowship.




